



Riders Eduction Article

Well, it's January and riding has pretty much come to a full halt as we work our way through the winter months. But on the bright side, each day now we are closer and closer to riding season once again. Christmas and New Year's have passed us by and in just a few months we'll be removing the covers from our bikes and looking to the first ride of the year. I thought I'd take a moment

and look at some facts and figures of motorcycle safety and to give us time to think about the new riding year that's just down the road.

A few years ago I attended a Motorcycle Safety Conference in Massachusetts and became aware of some interesting information. Whether it is Massachusetts or New Hampshire the information seemed broad based and applicable to all of us. Here are a few facts and figures to think about: Motorcycles with ABS had less fatal crashes. Also reduced claim frequency for collision, medical payments, and total liability. So there is substance to having this feature.

Touring bikes had the least frequency of fatal crashes while cruiser/sport bikes had the most. Good news for us Wing riders.

Saturday and Sundays had 41% of fatal crashes. The time period having the most is 3 PM to 9PM with 25% from 6PM to 9PM. So our early morning departures actually are safer. Most if the time we're back home by late afternoon.

Those who have owned a bike for less than 1 year account for 40% of the fatalities. The highest age group seemed to be 20-29. Those with a permit or less than 1 year riding experience accounted for 60%. So our years of riding and training does actually make us safer and less likely to be a statistic.

51% of fatalities occurred less than 5 miles from home.

This one stands out the most. 79% had NO TRAINING.

We often talk about watching the left hand turn. This one accounts for 67% of causes along with speeding being 58%. I know we preach watching the left hand turning vehicles and us in the left hand turn. This is the reason why.

A curve accounts for 32% and intersections 37%. Again we always alert one another in these locations.

As some of you know I spent many years working as a firefighter and EMT and can tell you the many accident calls that I responded to involved motorcycles. I was always amazed and sad that

so many riders had no training or very little riding experience. Yet, they would jump on a bike and think they could handle anything. I've actually seen riders drive straight into a utility pole. The old axiom of the bike will go where you are looking is true. They would lose a little control see what's ahead and drive straight into it.

So when we approach the riding season it will be time to think about the basics of riding, refresh our skills, and maybe take a rider safety course, even if we have done so in the past. Nothing beats being prepared. You don't need luck, just skill to stay safe.




